


Tip: You can set up a timeline to run from Week 1 onwards, by:

- Starting the timeline in the first week of the next year. (It is better to use NEXT year, as then any meetings and milestones you set up will not be "overdue" and appear in red)
- Using the Format Dialogue > Timescale Rows tab to: a) select just the week rows for display, and; b) adjusting the date format prefix to show W (week number)





## Example 6 – current vs. baseline timeline



Use CNTL + R as the short cut to put the timeline into 'review mode' - which will show the timeline against its baseline.

The current timing of activities can be shown relative to their baseline dates.

Milestones can also be shown relative to their baseline dates.
